This program includes songs influenced by prairies, canyon lands, and shores of the American west, the mountain villages of Japan, and the lanes and docks of Liverpool. Be prepared for beautiful long tones, delicate percussion and heart stopping pauses.



Gary Stroutsos draws on many cultures and places to create his own romantic music. His influences include jazz and Afro-Cuban, Native American, and Far Eastern musical traditions. He is a master of the Native American flute, the Chinese xiao and dize, as well his classical, 100 year old, Haines flute. He is perhaps best known for his work with American Indian cultures, his feature in Ken Burns PBS documentary, "Lewis and Clark: The Journey of the Corps of Discovery," his command performance for

President Clinton at the White House, and his many festival and concert appearances. Recently, he has been working on several projects that have been influenced by some of the more mystical pieces that the Beatles recorded over 30 years ago. Stroutsos has over 25 CDs to his credit.

Although **David Revelli** studied Middle Eastern drumming and tabla early on, he gained a wide reputation as a popular drummer for Mary Chapin Carpenter, Jewel, and Sheryl Crow as well as bands including The Grassy Knoll, Half Japanese, Sun Kil Moon and Schoolyard Junkie. However, Revelli recently re-connected with the fundamental aspects of drumming. This urge has taken him back to the ancient frame drums from the Middle East and the clay udus of Nigeria. These primal sounds beautifully complement the tones and textures of Gary Stroutsos' flutes. David's passion has become searching for ways to communicate more emotional intensity with fewer notes. Revelli has recorded with a number of artists.
